Use the copy below to record a Public Service Announcement (PSA) or provide it to a local station as “live copy” to be read on-air.

Some tips for submitting a radio PSA:

- Edit the copy as appropriate to include your local organization promoting the message.
- Research the requirements of your local radio station online or by contacting the station’s director of public or community affairs. Some stations accept pre-recorded PSAs; others prefer scripts and they may each have different instructions.
- Follow each station’s specific requirements, which may direct you to fill out an online form or send email details, and may necessitate edits to the copy.
- Personal contacts are always a plus – perhaps a friend or board member knows someone at a local radio station or you know a local celebrity that is willing to record your message.
