School's Out. Now What? Communities Across America to Celebrate National Summer Learning Day on July 12

Hundreds of communities join the National Summer Learning Association (NSLA) in tackling summer learning loss and ensuring kids stay safe, healthy and active this summer

(Baltimore, MD – July 5, 2018)- Hundreds of libraries, museums, non-profits, municipalities, school districts, Major League Baseball teams (Braves, Padres and Orioles), and Mayors of cities and towns across America will host nearly 1,000 science, math, reading, sports, and arts-related events to celebrate National Summer Learning Day Thursday, July 12, 2018.

Literacy will take center stage as part of this year's National Summer Learning Day with a National Read-Aloud of the award-winning book, *Trombone Shorty*, the true story of a boy in New Orleans (author Troy "Trombone Shorty" Andrews) who follows his passion to become a professional musician. The book's acclaimed illustrator and 2016 Caldecott Honor recipient, Bryan Collier, will serve as this year's national Summer Learning Ambassador. Library systems in Chicago, King County (WA), Salt Lake City, San Francisco, Nashville, New Orleans, and New York will serve as flagship Summer Learning Day sites for the National Read-Aloud. NSLA encourages kids and families everywhere to grab a copy of Trombone Shorty and join in the National Read Aloud at home, a local library or under a shady tree at the park.

BACKGROUND

Research confirms that many kinds of informal or high-quality formal enrichment opportunities can make a difference in stemming summer learning loss and ultimately closing the country's achievement gap. See *Summer by the Numbers* Infographic. Many communities are making measurable progress in providing the services and supports students need to stay safe and stay on track in the school year ahead but there's still much work ahead. In fact, a recent RAND Corporation/Wallace Foundation study, the largest-ever on summer learning, showed students with high attendance (20 or more days) in free, voluntary, district-based summer learning programs experienced educationally meaningful benefits in math and reading. The study also found that high attendance in voluntary summer programs isn't the only factor in student outcomes. Students who received at least 25 hours of math or 34 hours of English Language Arts instruction in a given summer did better than control group students on tests in fall 2013 and fall 2014.

Learning Association (NSLA), aimed at elevating the importance of keeping kids learning, safe and healthy every summer so students start the school year strong and can thrive

all year long.

As part of National Summer Learning Day, the National Summer Learning Association announces an inaugural #LoveLearning Campaign with retailer Lands' End, a classic American lifestyle brand. - New York Public Library (NYPL) National Summer Learning Day marks the mid-way point in the Library's Summer Reading program. NYPL branches in the Bronx, Manhattan, and Staten Island will host music-themed storytimes that feature Bryan Collier's picture book Trombone Shorty. Boroughs will host programs that include art workshops through a partnership with the Children's Museum of Manhattan, as well as themes inspired by music, the cosmos and rockets for children and teens through the Library's Hands on Science Program.
- New Orleans Public Library The home of famous musician Troy Andrews will celebrate with a reading of Trombone Shorty; discuss living in New Orleans while making sound sandwich instruments.
